# **European Charter on the Participation of Young People in Local and Regional Life**

## Right

implicit right to participate
it is not dependent on local or regional authorities
it is a fundamental right
active in promoting their rights
influencing local decisions by consultations or voting
activities, projects or organisations should promote rights
in all areas of life - not only civil or political rights, but also social, economic or cultural ones.

#### Means

basic needs like food or shelter are not met may feel isolated or left out of society focus on obtaining missing resources instead of participating ensure basic needs are met sufficient social security, education, housing, health care, transportation, know-how and access to technology.

#### **Space**

physical space to meet spend time or to organise own activities Internet used more and more as a space for exchanging views or even setting up projects with others not only about physical space participate within the institutional framework of policy making young people's views, recommendations and conclusions should have a real impact on decisions

### Opportunity

need to be provided with the opportunity to do access to information on how to get involved what opportunities are available and where make informed decisions about their involvement decision-making processes and systems need to be youth-friendly space for young people within these processes and structures way organised and way they work should be understandable having sufficient time and supportive structures

involvement not as efficient as it could be

## Support

access to various forms of support financial, moral and institutional support personal, organisational or at local community level local authorities should provide adequate financial support to cover expenses and structural costs moral support and advice by a person referred to in the revised charter as a guarantor, youth worker or other professional institution or community to support and recognise importance and contribution of youth participation
